



State Accountability & School Letter Grades



BUHSD is proud to announce that, with the most recent release of letter grades based on performance during the 2022-23 school year, both Estrella Foothills High School and Youngker High School were rated as “A” schools with Buckeye Union High School being rated as a “B” school. Based on these, the district was rated an “A” district.

These labels are in compliance with federal and state laws that require that the Arizona Department of Education, with final approval by the Arizona State Board of Education, develop annual achievement profiles for every public school in the state. Arizona’s system results in every school being rated with grades A through F.

The Arizona State Board of Education, in an FAQ about statewide accountability, states that the letter grade of an “A” means that the school/district has shown “distinguished performance on the statewide assessment, significant student growth, high four-year graduation rates, students on track to proficiency” with “overall performance significantly higher than state average.” A letter grade of a “B” means the school/district has shown “high performance on statewide assessment and/or significant student growth and/or higher four-year graduation rates and/or moving students to proficiency at a higher rate than the state average.”

We are proud of the work our students and teachers do every day in the classroom. These letter grades are a result of that work.

FOCUS ON GROWTH

Buckeye Union High School District was recognized as the top performer in the State for ACT growth from the 22-23 school year. The ACT test is taken by students in the 11th grade across the state. This test measures student learning in English & Math for Arizona’s statewide assessment. Year over year our students had the highest increase in test scores across all Arizona districts as reported by ABC 15 news. We achieved a 9-point increase in Math and 13-point increase in English.

It was a great accomplishment, and it was gratifying to be able to celebrate with teachers, staff, and this group of students who are now seniors on our campuses this current school year. One of our driving forces as a district is to take our students from the level they are at when they enter our schools and help them to expand and grow not only academically, but in their Future Ready preparation for their goals after high school graduation.

Starting in the 2018-2019 school year, BUHSD undertook the journey to ask stakeholders what being “college and career ready” meant in our district. Over a few years, and through a variety of formats (including surveys, brainstorming activities with students, staff, parent forums, and community meetings that included business officials, politicians, and educators of all levels), the vision of what BUHSD wanted for its graduates came together with the more encompassing term of *“Future Ready”*.

Gear Up is a federal grant-funded program that serves students from 9th-12th grade. Gear Up stands for Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs.

This program allows the district to have Gear Up Coaches on each campus who work in conjunction with the Counseling departments and the Future Ready Teachers to help students successfully navigate high school and to help them prepare for their post-secondary life.

The Gear Up Coaches hold many workshops throughout the year to help students choose their career pathways, to help them and their families navigate the college and university admissions process, and assist them in researching and completing scholarship applications. Some of the most important workshops the Gear Up Coaches sponsor are the ones to help students and their families to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid or FAFSA. Many colleges and universities require families to complete the FAFSA before they will consider giving students any financial aid. BUHS, EFHS, and YHS all saw double digit increases in their FAFSA completion rate this year. Students also were able to tour the following schools: Arizona State University, the University of Arizona, Grand Canyon University, West-MEC, Estrella Mountain Community College, as well as some vocational schools. Gear Up also brings College, Military, and Vocational school representatives to each school site so that the students have a chance to talk to them directly.

BUHS, EFHS, and YHS had a total of \$31.7 million dollars in scholarships awarded to their students. This included 3 Dorrance Scholarship winners who earned a total of \$100,000 each. There was also 1 Flinn Scholarship winner who was awarded \$130,000 for their education. The district also had 1 Questbridge scholarship winner who will receive over \$200,000 over the course of four years. These are in addition to the many other scholarships that students received for both in state and out of state schools. These students all worked extremely hard to earn these scholarships and we are immensely proud of them.

CTE CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Students are motivated to learn through the Career and Technical Education (CTE) instructional delivery system that focuses on relevant classroom and interactive laboratory instruction, work-based learning, leadership and community involvement. CTE is for all students, regardless of their plans after high school. A variety of CTE programs are offered that will help fit the needs for any Career Pathway a student may be interested in whether they plan to attend a university, community college, technical school, join the military, or go to work immediately after high school.

CTE Programs include many benefits. They give students the opportunity to:

- Build career and technical skills that apply directly to the workforce;
- Strengthen soft skills such as communication and critical thinking;
- Be exposed to different types of careers within the 16 Career Clusters;
- Prepare to take industry-recognized certification exams or dual enrollment courses.

All CTE programs are career-focused where students are preparing for immediate employment and further education in the career field.

Unified Sports joins people with and without intellectual disabilities on the same team. It was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to friendship and understanding. In Unified Sports, teams are made up of people of similar age and ability. Congratulations on a year of success in Unified Sports for the Buckeye Union High School District!

- YHS and EFHS reached banner status in just the 2nd year of their programs.
- EFHS had AIA state winners and finalists in 2 sports.
- YHS had AIA state finalists.
- Students from EFHS and BUHS were able to take part in a full day of interviews and media days for the Super Bowl in Arizona, some of which have led to follow up events for the students to be interviewed for a national podcast.
- BUHSD was able to solidify Unified Programming at BUHS, EFHS, and YHS. Students across our district now have access to a fully credited Unified PE class for students with and without disabilities to compete and advocate together for inclusion campus/community-wide.
- Each BUHSD school offers Unified PE, supports a Unified Club, and hosts local and state Special Olympics Arizona and Arizona Interscholastic Association qualifying tournaments, competitions, and special events.
- BUHSD competed in the Unified Sports competitions that included: aquatics (swim), badminton, bocce ball, soccer, basketball, flag football, volleyball, track and field, and esports.
- BUHSD now offers the Unified PE class to over 70 students of all abilities and engages the whole school through Unified School Dances, inclusion weeks, and pep assemblies.
- BUHS, YHS, and EFHS hosted dances for students with disabilities to enjoy a campus experience in a sensory-safe environment.
- YHS hosted an AIA Unified Track and Field competition, EFHS hosted a Special Olympics area Unified Basketball qualifying tournament and SOAZ Powerlifting competition, and BUHS hosted an AIA Unified Soccer qualifying tournament.
- Travis Haley and Chad Williams were able to attend the Pre-Super Bowl Activities with a Unified Athlete from EFHS and a Unified Athlete from BUHS.
- Students in the Life Skills program learned inclusive health, hygiene, and social skills through Special Olympics Arizona's Healthy LEAP Curriculum.

LIFE SKILLS AND TRANSITION TO WORK PROGRAM

- Students in the Life Skills program had access to on-campus and in-community experiences that empowered the students to showcase their functional, transferrable skills.
- Our Transition from School to Work program continues to grow in the Buckeye Community.

BUHSD LEARNING CENTER SCHOOL

Home of the Bulldogs | Established 2011

Established in 2011, the Buckeye Union High School District Learning Center provides opportunities for students who may desire or need an environment different than the traditional high school campus.

In the alternative program, the focus is to prepare students for college and/or career within a smaller environment. Edgenuity, a computer-based academic curriculum aligned to Arizona State Academic Standards and district curricula, is the main platform for instruction. Students attend classes during the week on the BUHSD Learning Center campus with three highly qualified teachers on site to monitor course progression and assist students with academic needs. Through BUHSD Institute of Online Learning (LcOnline), students progress at their own pace using Edgenuity as well, but they work from home with 24/7 access to their classes. District highly qualified teachers monitor and support students' progress and are available to help students when needed. The Learning Center also houses other programs that assist students who qualify for Special Education Services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. These specialized programs allow students to receive the supports and services they need on a district campus rather than having to travel a distance to specialized schools in the Phoenix area.
